Stephen Ministry Fact Sheet

History

Stephen Ministry began in 1975 when the Rev. Kenneth C. Haugk, Ph.D., a pastor and clinical psychologist, trained nine members of his congregation in St. Louis to be Stephen Ministers. They assisted him in providing Christian care and support to people in the congregation and community who were experiencing life difficulties. These trained caregivers encouraged Dr. Haugk to offer Stephen ministry to more congregations.

Over the next few years, Dr. Haugk traveled to congregations and trained Stephen Ministers. This quickly proved to be inefficient, since he could visit only a limited number of congregations, and these congregations were then dependent on him to train additional caregivers. So in 1978 Stephen Ministries held the first Leader's Training Course and trained the first Stephen Leaders—representatives of various congregations who then returned home to train and supervise their own Stephen Ministers. Since then Stephen Ministries St. Louis has specialized in "training the trainers" through the Stephen Series ministry system.

The Name

The name Stephen comes from St. Stephen, who was the first layperson commissioned by the Apostles to provide caring ministry to those in need (Acts 6).

Stephen Ministry Statistics

• Over 12,000 congregations are enrolled in the Stephen Series. They represent 172 different Christian denominations and come from all 50 states, 10 Canadian provinces, and 27 countries.

• More than 70,000 pastors, church staff, and laypeople have trained as Stephen Leaders. These Stephen Leaders have trained more than 600,000 congregation members to be Stephen Ministers.

From our pastors ...

A lot has been happening at St. John's this summer around both the outside and inside of our building. Some that has been easy to see and some that has been hard to see.

You have probably noticed *some* construction around St. John's this summer! It hasn't been hard to miss the "Road Closed Ahead" signs. The most obvious project was the reconstruction of 2nd street, due to be finished by the time this newsletter is published! Notable for St. John's in this work is a brand-new sidewalk on the northside, adorned with two poems from Northfield's Sidewalk Poetry project. One of the two poems is the work of St. John's member Anne Sovik.

What you *haven't* likely noticed is a tremendous amount of maintenance work that was accomplished this summer. That has been much harder to see. Over 70 rotting windows were replaced in June, funded by memorial gifts as well as a release of some reserve funds. Many of these windows look the same as before now – except that they are operational and are no longer rotting!

Next up is work on the flooring of the office and classroom southwest wing. Peeling tiles in this part of the building will be covered by carpet in most areas, and by acoustically-friendly wood flooring in the children's choir room. Finally many of these halls and offices will get a fresh coat of paint. There may be some disruption of normal office work during the week that floors need to be cleared, so please be patient during the first weeks of September.

We invite you to let your eyes be opened to this hard and necessary but often invisible work that has happened for the good upkeep of our building. Keep an eye out for the new sidewalk and Anne's poetry. Check out the new windows. Peek in the office spaces and the upstairs to appreciate the new look. This hard work is ministry that benefits us all and the future of St. John's.

We offer many thanks to our tremendously organized Tim Byers, Troy Sorensen and the Properties & Grounds Committee for shepherding the plans for this deferred maintenance of our building. And thanks to all of YOU for your generosity in continuing to provide for the care of our facility.

Reconciling In Christ Adult Forum – September 27th, 9:45 a.m.

On Sunday, September 27th, the Reconciling In Christ (RIC) committee will be hosting the adult forum. As many of you know, St. John's is currently in a discernment process around whether we are in a place to become an RIC congregation. Briefly stated, an RIC congregation is one that creates an intentional welcome statement, reaching out to those who often feel alienated from the church, which specifically includes welcoming people from the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) community. This forum will address the questions "What is RIC?" and "Why Now?" There will also be an opportunity for some small group discussion around the topic of welcome and what questions you might have.



As a reminder to us all, this is the beginning of a conversation. Talking about becoming an RIC congregation can be difficult but we all have much to learn and benefit from one another as the Body of Christ, embracing even those who hold different opinions. Wherever you are at along the continuum, please join us at this forum so that we can begin journeying through this together.

What are Monthly Hospitality Groups All About?

Everyone at St. John's gets to be part of a Group that performs the following Sunday morning hospitality services: Welcome Desk and Greeting;

Why did we reintroduce monthly groups for Sunday hospitality at St. John's?

- To make it possible for all of us to share in providing the hospitality services we enjoy every Sunday; and
- To give everyone at St. John's the opportunity to get to know eachother while working together to provide this warm welcome.

How many Monthly Groups are there?

- There are NINE groups altogether; each group serves on the Sundays during their month.
- For example, during this month, September, Group 6 is providing Sunday morning hospitality.
- Group 6 will serve again in June of 2016 after the Nine-month rotation is complete.

Why are there Nine Groups?

- We were advised to have Seven or Nine Groups by experienced former Hospitality Group Leaders.
- We are hoping that Nine Groups will have enough people in each group for each person to serve only about two times during their month and still provide for all the hospitality needs in the month.

How do I find out what Group I am in and when I will serve?

- If you have an email address on file with St. John's, then I have sent you a message with your monthly group number and a list of all your group's members. Let me know if you didn't receive one!
- If you haven't yet heard from me, then you will be receiving a letter in the mail the month before your group is scheduled to serve.

Music and Worship Life at St. John's

Friends,

September is almost upon us, and with it comes the start of another choir season. When I first sat down to write to you, I thought about a new school year and how we join our voices in a new song. I thought that discovering your "new song" might be experiencing something new in worship, or deciding to participate in the adult choir, or encouraging your children to sing in one of our children's choirs. And while all these things are most definitely true, learning of the loss of Kenneth Jennings and Steve Swanson in our community suddenly guided my thoughts in a different direction.

As I reflect on the amazing lives of these two individuals, I am struck by the idea that both of these great men were creators. At first glance, they were creators of art, music, sculpture, and poetry, but they were also creators of community. Wherever they went, from pastoring 45 churches to guiding countless St. Olaf students to conducting the St. Olaf Choir for 25 years, creativity, and the love of creating something beautiful, followed them.



Irish poet and author John O'Donohue, in his book Beauty: The Invisible Embrace writes:

At the deepest level, creativity is holiness. To create is to further the dream and desire of the creator. Made in the image and likeness of the Divine Imagination, human creativity helps to add to creation. The unfinished is an invitation to our imagination.

This notion that "creativity is holiness" strikes at my very core. It is what I hope happens each time we sing together in worship. Each Sunday, and at each service, a unique collection of people open their mouths, offer praise to God, and create something holy that can never be experienced in the exact same way again.

This Sunday (August 30) as we begin worship, we start by singing "The Earth Adorned (Psalm of Summer)" by Swedish composer Waldemar Ahlen, with an English text translated by Carolyn and Kenneth Jennings. The music is gorgeous, but the text is truly a work of art in itself. The song begins by describing the beauty of creation as it gently emerges from winter. The sunshine, the fragrant flowers, the birds, and the woods all join their voices with the entire universe in giving thanks to God. In the final stanza, we take our place in this creation, acknowledging that while this beauty may be fleeting, the God that we praise remains forever. In the bulletin you will find the full text and music so that you may continue to study the richness found in this hymn. My hope is that whether you sang this in the St. Olaf Choir, grew up listening to this on the *Reflections of Norway* CD, or are experiencing it for the very first time, you can join your voice as we mourn and celebrate the lives of Steve and Kenneth, two profound creators.

He was one of the kindest and most thoughtful people I have ever met. At a development staff meeting someone made a statement that it was hard to give to various causes and to pay one's bills as well.

Jennings addressed the person and told the following story: When he and his wife were first married and organizing their finances, they paid their bills first and then made their charitable donations. They then made the observation that it seemed they had little disposable income for themselves. Then they made a change in how they did this. They made their charitable donations first and then paid their bills. They said they were amazed at how much disposable income they then had for themselves! I hope this example will help you as you reach your decision regarding your financial support of St. John's.



FROM BREAD FOR THE WORLD

Congress and the president are making major decisions that could harm individuals and families living in poverty and at risk of hunger. These are issues that are moving in Congress or the administration. They pose potential or serious threats. This is an important time to get involved and make your voice heard.

Anti-hunger programs must be protected from harmful cuts. The tight fiscal environment means members of Congress are looking to make cuts wherever they can. Foreign assistance, SNAP (formerly food stamps), and other programs that help people struggling with hunger are at serious risk.



These people don't have high-powered lobbyists and well-funded campaigns looking out for their interests.

One in five children in the U.S. lives at risk of hunger. Domestic child nutrition programs are up for renewal in 2015. Congress must reauthorize the national school lunch and breakfast programs, the summer meals program, the child care food program, and the WIC nutrition program for pregnant and new mothers along with their small children. This issue is the focus of Bread's 2015 Offering of Letters campaign.

St. John's will participate in that campaign this fall. Watch and listen for details this month and next. Remember that it is possible to advocate for people in hunger and poverty anytime by calling the Capitol Switchboard (800-826-3688) and asking to speak with the office of Congressman John Kline or Senators Klobuchar or Franken.
