



Dear Friends in Christ:

On February 12, St. John's Children, Youth, and Family boards hosted our annual Youth Fundraiser Silent Auction and Breakfast, and it was a major success. In the past five years, this year has raised the most funds, which are close to \$7,300. Included in this number are the handful of individual donations given simply to fully sponsor a child or youth who would not otherwise be able to afford going to camp. We feel that an added success of this fundraiser is that many of you have taken up the challenge to offer relational fundraiser items – wine and cheese parties, group game nights, music and art lessons, and much more. Not only are we supporting our children and youth, but we are supporting each other by gathering together in relationship.

So, where does this money go? How does this money support our children, youth, and families?

Each summer, our summer programming for our children and youth include three opportunities. First, St. John's Director of Children's Ministry, Julie Brehmer, partners with Bethel Lutheran, St. Peter's Lutheran, and Emmaus to offer Vacation Bible School (VBS) for 3 year olds through 4th graders in Northfield. This year's theme is *Hero Central*, where kids will learn about their favorite Biblical heroes, while also discovering the qualities in themselves that make them heroes in the kingdom of God.

Next, each summer St. John's sends 2nd through 8th graders to Green Lake Bible Camp for a classic summer Bible camp experience filled with fun, faith, and friends.

Finally, each summer, St. John's Director of Youth Ministry, Mike Skunes, leads a trip with High School Youth. These High School trips are on a three-year cycle: Mission Trip, National Youth Gathering, Backpacking Trip. This year is a mission trip year with 11 people currently signed up to go to Nashville, TN. In 2018, we will send youth to the ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston, TX. In 2019, we will head back to Christikon for a mountain backpacking trip!

With these three children and youth programs happening, your fundraising dollars help to reduce the cost for each participant and to make possible full scholarships when needed.

Because of all of this, our hearts are full of gratitude.

Thank you. Thank you for the many ways in which you care for and support the children, youth, and families of St. John's. Thank you for your spirit of generosity which ensures that no child or youth will be prevent from attending VBS, camp, or a mission trip due to financial constraints.

Stephen Ministers:With You at Hard Times



Poetry Forum with Rob Hardy, Northfield's Poet Laureate Sunday, April 2

On Sunday, April 2, the Adult Forum will continue its tradition of an annual poetry reading. Rob Hardy, Northfield's newly appointed poet laureate, will be with us to read some of his poetry.



In 2016, the Northfield Public Library and Arts & Culture Commission appointed Hardy to a three-year term as Northfield's first Poet Laureate. In this role, Hardy is seen as coordinator and creative leader of poetic and literary arts in the community. The decision to appoint a poet laureate is part of an overall effort to advance the visibility, quality, and ap-


preciation of poetic arts in schools, among practicing poets, and for public audiences.

Thank offerings given to the church by families for funeral receptions are put in a fund to update and maintain kitchen equipment.

And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' Matthew 25:40

What comes to mind for you when the word "funeral" is mentioned? Loss, sadness, not knowing what to say? St. John's Funeral Hospitality Teams are groups of faithful women and men from all ages in our congregation who provide an atmosphere of calm healing with food after a service commemorating the life of a loved one. We have had numerous faithful women and men be involved in this ministry for grieving people at St. John's over many years. For this vital outreach to continue, our Funeral Hospitality Teams need your help.

Funeral receptions at St. John's have evolved over the years. Up until 2000 we served sandwiches and cake during primarily afternoon funerals. After St. John's Hall and Kitchen were built, we began having morning funerals. This timing allows the family time to gather afterwards to process, grieve, and support each other. When the St. John's Catering Committee dissolved in August of 2000, seven of their members, now all octogenarians, offered to continue making hot dishes (e.g. chicken wild rice casserole) for funeral receptions.

Funerals are one way we celebrate life, and what better way than at a beautifully set table with nourishing food and people who care? How could you help to continue this vital ministry?

- Set tables
- Brew or serve coffee
- Host in the dining room
- Cut and plate cakes and bars
- Bus dishes, wipe tables
- Run the dishwasher
- Hand wash dishes



From Bread for the World:

Rev. David Beckman, Bread for the World President, writes:



Pope Francis, Bill Gates and the World Bank have each presented convincing evidence that ending hunger and extreme poverty by 2030 is within reach and most U.S. pastors agree. All the nations of the world have agreed to work for the end of hunger and related goals by 2030.

As Christians reflect on these hopeful developments, we recognize God at work in the world. We are moved by our experience of God's grace in Jesus Christ to do our part to help end hunger - through direct assistance to people in need and as advocates on public policies affecting hungry and struggling people. Powerful forces in Congress will be pushing to dismantle or cut funding for many of the programs that help these people in our country and worldwide. Programs threatened with deep cuts include those that offer direct help to buy food for infants and families in this country. Also in peril are international programs, including nutrition assistance for young children and investments that help struggling farmers grow more food and nourish their families and communities.

Government programs cannot by themselves end hunger. Families, churches and charities, and businesses also have to play their parts. But we can only end hunger if our national government does its part. Doing our part as Christians this year includes advocacy with our members of Congress to ensure they make funding decisions that put us on track to ending hunger by 2030.
